

Fairfax County Well Water Testing: 2022 Drinking Water Clinic

Do you have a well, spring or cistern?

Learn about your water quality through affordable, confidential testing!
The goal of the Virginia Household Water Quality Program is to improve the water quality and health of Virginians with private water supplies, like wells and springs.

How does it work?

1. Pick up your sample kit at the Fairfax County Extension office, located in the Pennino Human Services Building.
2. Collect samples the morning of September 14 and drop off at the Extension office.
3. Samples are analyzed at Virginia Tech.
4. Receive your confidential results, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing problems via email about 4 weeks later. A live video or recorded video presentation will help you understand your results.



What does the water test include?

Iron	Manganese	Sulfate	Hardness
Sodium	Copper	Nitrate	Arsenic
Fluoride	pH	Total Dissolved Solids	
Coliform bacteria	<i>E. coli</i> bacteria	Lead	

How much does it cost? \$65 per sample kit. Refunds (minus \$5 processing fee) are available until August 26 at 4:30 pm.
