The Fairfax County Park Authority maintains 427 parks and more than 23,000 acres of parkland across Fairfax County. Please remember the following if you encounter damage in Fairfax parks or trails.

please DO



REPORT DAMAGE

Report damage via FCPA's online reporting tool so that we may track and respond to damage county-wide.



EXERCISE CAUTION

FCPA's goal is to clean up the parks as quickly as possible. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we address damage and work to keep our parks safe.

please DON'T



CHOP OR MOVE TREES

Please do not attempt to cut, saw, hatchet, move or remove downed trees by any means.



REMOVE FALLEN TREE

Trees and other vegetation help filter pollutants and prevent erosion and contamination. Removal of downed trees for firewood or any other reason is illegal.
