

Floris Historic District is a representation of the development of a community based on dairy farming production in Northern Virginia from the late nineteenth to the mid twentieth centuries. The rise of dairy farming in Virginia, and Fairfax County in particular, continues to be represented by the development patterns and architecture of Floris as the center of a vibrant dairying community. In 1785 the earliest building in the district, the Frying Pan Meetinghouse, was built. Following that construction was the development of the dominant dairy farming industry and construction of Floris as a cohesive village.
