

Silverbrook United Methodist Church was built between 1906 and 1908 as a Methodist church during the early twentieth century and displays the architectural characteristics of the late Gothic Revival Style. The church stands as the only remaining early-twentieth-century Gothic Revival-style church in Fairfax County. Silverbrook was originally constructed due to the need of a Methodist Church within walking distance for the residents of Lorton. The decision to build a Gothic Revival style building connected this small rural farming community to national architectural trends and made the community church part of our national heritage. The builders were Robert L. Harrover, whose title was main carpenter, and A. W. Grimsley. Silverbrook Church continues to serve as a focus for its community.
