Between March and August of 2018, 20 transportation projects were completed, including 17 bicycle and pedestrian projects, two roadway projects, and one transit project. October is National Cyber Security Awareness Month



National Cybersecurity Awareness Month is commemorating its 15th year as an annual initiative to raise awareness about the importance of cybersecurity. It is a

collaborative effort between government and industry to ensure everyone has the resources they need to stay safer and more secure online, while increasing the resiliency of the nation during cyber threats.

Cybersecurity Tips:

- Use strong passwords, passcodes, or other features such as touch identification to lock your devices.
- Protect accounts with strong authentication.
- Links in email, tweets, posts, and online advertising are often how cybercriminals try to compromise your information. If it looks suspicious, delete it.
- Protect against data loss by making electronic copies of important files.
- Protect your data by being cautious about how your information is collected by apps and websites.
- Respond quickly to identity theft, fraud, and crime.
- Limit the type of business you conduct and adjust the security settings on your device to limit who can access your device when using Wi-Fi hotspots.
- When banking or shopping online, check to be sure the site is security
 enabled. Look for web addresses with https:// or shttp://, which means the
 site takes extra measures to help secure your information.
