1st Installment of 2019 Real Estate Taxes Due Monday, July 29



The first installment of 2019 real estate taxes is due on Monday, July 29, 2019.

Payment Options:

Fairfax County offers a variety of <u>payment options</u> to make paying your taxes as simple and convenient as possible.

- MyFairfax Secure Portal MyFairfax is your home to conduct key online transactions with the county, including: viewing real estate information, paying your bills, changing your mailing address, and more.
- Pay Online Pay real estate taxes online by e-Check or credit/debit card. Please note that there is a <u>service fee</u> of 2.5% on the total amount paid for Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express credit card payments and MasterCard and Visa debit card payments.
- Pay By Phone If you are paying by VISA, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express, call 703-222-6740, TTY 711 (24 hours a day, 7 days a week). Third-party service fees apply.
- Pay By Mail Make checks payable to "County of Fairfax". Mail to:
 Department of Tax Administration (12000 Government Center Parkway,
 Suite 223, Fairfax, VA 22035). Do not send cash. Payment must be postmarked on or before the due date to be considered on time.
- Pay in Person Pay by check, cash, credit or debit card at the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 223, Fairfax, VA 22035) on weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; open

until 6:30 p.m. on Thursdays. Third-party service fees apply for credit/debit card payments.




Social Visitors

Board of Supervisors Meeting -

The Board of Supervisors will meet on **Tuesday**, **July 30**, **2019** at 9:30 a.m. at the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, VA 22035) in the Board Auditorium. The meeting will be broadcast live on <u>Channel 16</u>. There is one* Sully District case on the <u>agenda</u>. More information about this case is below.

RZ 2019-SU-002 (JDA Custom Homes, Inc.) -

Located on the west side of West Ox Road approximately 300 feet south of Franklin Farm Road. This application is to rezone 6.35 acres from the R-1 zoning district to the PDH-2 zoning district for the development of 12 single family detached dwelling units at a density of 1.89 dwelling units/acre. County staff recommends approval of RZ 2019-SU-002, subject to the execution of proffers consistent with those contained in Appendix 1 of the staff-report. The Planning Commission recommends approval of RZ 2019-SU-002, subject to the execution of proffered conditions consistent with those dated July 16, 2019.

*At their July 24, 2019 meeting, the Planning Commission voted to defer decision only on SE 2018-SU-027 (Stonebridge Investments, LLC) to a date certain of July 31, 2019. Therefore, the public hearing, scheduled for July 30, 2019, for this application will be deferred to a future Board of Supervisors meeting.

FREE Training Classes for Community Emergency Response Team



The <u>Community Emergency Response Team</u> (CERT) Program educates residents about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area. CERT trains county residents in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

The CERT training classes follow the FEMA curriculum, tailored to local disasters and hazards. The instructor will provide a syllabus with the class schedule at the first session. This training does not require any special physical strength or agility.

Public Feedback Invited on I-95 Corridor Improvement Study



The Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment, the Virginia Department of Transportation, and the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, under the leadership of the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB), are developing a plan to study Virginia's 179 miles of the I-95 corridor between the Woodrow Wilson Bridge in Alexandria, VA and the North Carolina border.

Feedback provided by members of communities, industries, and other stakeholders will be considered as team members study the corridor throughout the summer and prepare a draft plan report in the fall. The CTB plans to report findings to the General Assembly in December 2019.

The study team has developed a map-based <u>online engagement tool</u>. The tool will ask users to respond to a series of questions about how they travel the corridor and what types of improvements would benefit them, and to identify areas of concern.

Park Board Reviews Resource Management Plans



The Fairfax County Park Authority Board received updates on the agency's Cultural Resource Management Plan (CRMP) and Natural Resource Management Plan (NRMP) at its meeting on June 26, 2019.

Cultural Resources staff provided updates on the Resident Curator

Program (RCP). The program, which allows curators to live rent-free in park
properties in exchange for their work to rehabilitate the buildings, was honored in
FY 2019 with an award from the National Association of County Park and
Recreation Officials.

In addition, staff reported that numerous archaeological projects were completed at RCP sites in support of Natural Resource projects at Sully Woodlands and Colchester. Plans for FY 2020 include archaeological surveys at Riverbend Park, Mount Air, and Mount Gilead prior to work at those sites.

Keep Yard Waste Out of Natural Areas

Protect parks and streams from the harmful effects of dumping. Dumping is not composting.

Do bag it at the curb in recyclable containers of paper bags. Acceptable materials include: brush, grass clippings, leaves, and branches (no larger than 6" in diameter). **Don't** dump yard waste in common areas and storm drains. It is harmful and illegal! Don't bag pet waste, rocks, diseased plants, invasive plants, and plastic.

If in doubt leave it out. Don't contaminate yard waste - it gets processed into free community mulch and compost. Dispose of "Don't" items in your regular garbage.
