Sully Community Center Meeting -

The Sully Community Center meeting will take place on **Monday, October 1, 2018** at **7:00 p.m.** at the Sully Governmental Center (4900 Stonecroft Boulevard, Chantilly, VA 20151).

Fairfax County is proposing to build the new Sully Community Center on a 5-acre site at the intersection of Wall Road and the Air and Space Museum Parkway in Chantilly – near Highlands Park. The roughly 30,000 square-foot facility will serve as a multi-generational facility for the surrounding communities and will be the new and permanent location of the Sully Senior Center (currently operating in leased space in Chantilly). The center will be home to a broad array of services, programs, and activities for individuals of all ages and abilities. The project is currently in the initial stages of design and is scheduled to be completed in 2022. For more information on the project, click here.

2018 Car Tax Due Oct. 5: What You Need to Know



The county mailed out more than 800,000 annual bills this summer to vehicle owners and **the deadline to pay your bill is coming up on Friday, October 5**. The good news – there are many ways to pay and extended hours to help make the process easier for you.

Understanding Your Vehicle Tax:

If you have a question or concern about your tax bill, contact our customer service staff in the Department of Tax Administration. The hours are weekdays, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at 703-222-8234 (TTY 711), or send an email.

- Online with credit/debit card or checking account.
- Use your smartphone.
- By phone with your credit card.
- By mail.
- In person at the Government Center.

FCDOT Public Information Meetings



The <u>Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT</u>) will hold two public information meetings on the <u>Fairfax County & Franconia-Springfield Parkways</u> <u>Alternatives Analysis and Long Term Planning Study</u> to seek input on future corridor enhancements for the Parkways, based on residents' personal experiences and desires for multimodal access, connectivity, and overall operations.

- Tuesday, October 9, 2018, at Navy Elementary School, 3500 West Ox Road, Fairfax
- Thursday, October 11, 2018, at Sangster Elementary School, 7420
 Reservation Drive, Springfield

The meetings will begin with a presentation at 7:00 p.m., followed by a question and answer period at 7:30 p.m., and time for public input activities at 8:00 p.m. Both meetings contain the same agenda and format so that people have an opportunity to participate all along the corridor.

The Fairfax County & Franconia-Springfield Parkways Alternatives Analysis and

Long Term Planning Study, which builds upon the earlier VDOT Existing Conditions Analysis (2016), is intended to enhance and update future guidance for how the Parkways should evolve, over time, in the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan. Discussion and feedback during these meetings will help county staff to develop alternatives, including traffic mitigation strategies and multimodal connections, for evaluation, considering forecasted traffic conditions and future planned land uses.

Public input activities during these meetings will also be made available for online participation for 30 days, from October 11, 2018 through Friday, November 9, 2018.



Recent Cases:

RZ/FDP 2018-SU-008 & PCA 2009-SU-020-03 -

K. Hovnanian Homes at Pender Oaks LLC filed applications in order to rezone the 18.07-acre subject site from the Planned Development Commercial (PDC) district to the Planned Development Housing 12 (PDH-12) district. The rezoned property would be redeveloped from an existing office building with surface parking, to a residential community development consisting of a mix of housing unit types. The proposed development would feature 219 residential units with two-over-two stacked townhomes (56 units), single-family attached townhomes (91 units), and 72 condominium units. Community features include a tot lot, pool, and bath house/club house. Staff recommend approval of the zoning applications. For more information on the applications, click here. The Planning Commission originally heard this case on September 20, 2018 and deferred the decision-only to September 27. At its meeting on September 27, 2018 the Planning Commission

voted to recommend approval by unanimous vote.
